Goals of DeKalb County School District:

Goal Area I: Study Success with Equity and Access.

- Improve student's mastery of learning standards

The DeKalb County School District will increase the percentage of students scoring at the Developing Learner level or above on the Georgia Milestones Literature End of Course (EOC) Assessment. The DeKalb County School District will increase the percentage of students scoring at the Developing Learner level or above on the Georgia Milestones Math End of Course (EOC) Assessment. **At Tucker High School, we will** provide all students with high-quality curriculum and instruction in a supportive and effective learning environment

Academic Goals of Tucker High School

By the end of the 2024-2025 school year, Tucker High School will improve students scoring at developing or above ELA as measured by Georgia Milestones from 67% (SY 23-24) to 70% (SY 24-25) for all students enrolled in American Literature.

By the end of the 2024-2025 school year, Tucker High School will implement Standards Based Instructions in every classroom that engage students in learning and provide academic enrichment intervention for all students. In the Fall of 2023, our Algebra Map data showed that our median percentile value was 39%. In the Spring of 2024, our Algebra Map data showed that our median percent increased by 3% to 42%.

By the end of the 2024-2025 school year, we will improve the coverage daily attendance rate for students to 95% by reducing the percentage of students who are absent more than 10% from 16.1% to 12%.

By the end of the 2024 – 2025 school year, students in the graduation cohort year 2025 will have 90% graduation rate based on the monitoring and benchmarking and monthly monitoring of students in these subgroups.



As Tucker High School, we will...

- Provide parents with ongoing support by maintaining Infinite Campus and Canvas data to monitor their student academics, attendance, and assessments.
- Provide additional academic support within the school day and after-school tutorials to increase mastery in content for EOCT, AP, IB, and dual courses and implement advisement and ELT on Thursday.
- Offer schoolwide events such as Curriculum Night and Parent Teacher Conferences where parents will receive information and resources to help their child at home.
- Provide and maintain timely two-way communications to all stakeholders concerning student safety, attendance, and academic performance through emails, phone calls, Naviance, Tucker Tiger Notes, School Messenger, Bi-Weekly SARC Meetings, and attendance meetings. Parent Liaison will send home communication as well.
- Monitor all seniors at the beginning of August with monthly cohort checks.

As Tucker High School parents, we will...

- Monitor student grades, attendance, and assignments by signing up and checking Infinite Campus parent portal and Canvas weekly.
- Encourage students to participate in the academic support provided by Tucker High School within the school day during ELT time and after-school tutorials for EOC, AP, IB, and dual courses.
- Attend schoolwide events such as Curriculum Night and Parent Teacher Conferences to receive information and resources to work with your students at home.
- Stay up to date with school communications by reading and responding to emails and listening to school-related calls concerning student safety, attendance, and performance.
- Attend graduation conferences
